Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter surrenders, effective immediately, the International Section 214 Authorization of Expereo, USA Inc. ("Expereo") granted in IB File No. ITC-214-20100729-00309. Expereo does not provide telecommunications service to any U.S. customers on a common carrier basis or offer U.S. international telecommunications service for sale in the marketplace. For these reasons, Expereo respectfully submits that it is not subject to the customer notification requirements of Section 63.19 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.19.

Because Expereo does not currently provide international telecommunications service that require Section 214 authority, and therefore has no U.S. customers for these services, Expereo respectfully submits that the surrender of the International Section 214 authorization is reasonable and will not harm the present or future public interest, convenience and necessity.

Expereo is filing a letter to surrender its Domestic Section Authorization using ECFS.
