

On behalf of American Broadband, Inc. (“American Broadband”), this letter surrenders, effective immediately as of the date above, the company’s International Section 214 Authorization, granted in IB File No. ITC-214-20111005-00311.

American Broadband does not provide any services that require International Section 214 Authorization for regulatory purposes. In 2011, the company elected to apply for International Section 214 Authorization to satisfy a contractual requirement while conducting business with a customer in a foreign country. American Broadband is not, however, providing common carrier services, either domestically or abroad, which would require an International Section 214 Authorization. No customers of American Broadband will be impacted by this surrender, and thus the company is not subject to the customer notification requirements of 47 C.F.R. § 63.19.
