Dear Ms. Dortch:

iTalk Mobile Corporation (“iTalk Mobile”) hereby notifies the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) of its intent to surrender its international Section 214 authorization, issued under File No. ITC-214-20141117-00298, effective immediately.

iTalk Mobile was granted its Section 214 authorization subject to commitments and assurances provided to the Department of Justice, and is a signatory to a National Security Agreement (“NSA”), signed December 22, 2016.

iTalk Mobile does not currently provide international telecommunications services to any customers pursuant to the Section 214 authorization, and the company is therefore not required to provide notice of discontinuance pursuant to Section 63.19 of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.19.

On August 1, 2021, the assignment of all customers of iTalk Mobile to Ztar Mobile, Inc. (“Ztar”) was consummated. A copy of the required FCC notice of consummation has been filed by Ztar. The parties had received FCC approval for the transfer of iTalk Mobile’s customer base from to Ztar on April 23, 2021. See FCC Public Notice, DA-21-491A1, ITC-ASG-20210402- 00058, effective 4/23/2021.

iTalk Mobile has notified the Department of Justice that it does not provide services subject to the NSA, and that it intends to surrender the Section 214 authorization.
