

APPLICATION

eGlobe, Inc. ("eGlobe"), hereby requests authority pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.18(e)(3) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.18(e)(3), for the assignment of the Section 214 authorization of Trans Global Communications, Inc. ("Trans Global"), to a wholly-owned subsidiary of eGlobe. 1/

The assignment will occur as part of a merger transaction in which a newly-created subsidiary of eGlobe, eGlobe Merger Sub No. 6 ("Merger Sub"), will merge with Trans Global. eGlobe will be the surviving company. Stockholders of Trans Global will receive stock in eGlobe in exchange for their shares of Trans Global.

1/ eGlobe formerly was known as Executive TeleCard, Ltd. Notice of this name change was provided to the Commission by letter dated February 10, 2000.

Grant of this application will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity. This assignment will allow the applicants to manage their telecommunications operations more efficiently, permitting greater investment in customer services and technological innovation. Furthermore, the combination of eGlobe and Trans Global will provide customers of the two companies with a more diverse and comprehensive selection of services from a single vendor. This transaction will ensure continued provision of international services to Trans Global's existing customers and should promote competition and lower prices in the market for international services.

I. THE PARTIES

A. eGlobe, Inc.

eGlobe, Inc. is a non-dominant carrier in the United States which holds authorizations under Section 214 to resell international services. eGlobe provides services that enable the cards issued by its customers to be used as telephone calling cards. eGlobe provides these services through contractual arrangements with foreign and domestic carriers, in conjunction with proprietary billing and routing technology. eGlobe also provides a variety of services that use Internet Protocol (IP) technology. The company had revenues of approximately \$33 million for 1998.

eGlobe is a Delaware corporation with numerous subsidiaries, including several foreign subsidiaries. eGlobe subsidiaries hold authorizations to provide international telecommunications services in Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore and Japan, all

of which are WTO members. None of these subsidiaries own facilities or possess market power.

B. Trans Global Communications, Inc.

Trans Global is a non-dominant carrier in the United States which holds an authorization issued under Section 214 to provide international services. Trans Global provides these services through contractual arrangements with foreign and domestic carriers, in conjunction with proprietary billing technology. Trans Global also provides co-location and switch partitioning services. The company had revenues of approximately \$85 million for 1998.

Trans Global is a New York corporation with numerous subsidiaries. Trans Global has a foreign subsidiary in the United Kingdom which is authorized to provide international telecommunications services. This subsidiary does not possess market power.

II. DESCRIPTION OF THE TRANSACTION

The assignment of Trans Global's Section 214 authorization will occur as part of a merger transaction in which Merger Sub, a newly-created, wholly-owned subsidiary of eGlobe will merge with Trans Global. Trans Global will be the surviving company after the merger, and will remain a separate subsidiary of eGlobe. Trans Global will continue to serve all existing customers under the same terms as those customers received prior to the merger.

III. REQUEST FOR CONSENT TO ASSIGNMENT

Pursuant to Section 63.18(e)(5) of the Commission's Rules, the applicants set forth the following information:

(d) eGlobe is authorized to resell international services pursuant to its Section 214 authorization granted in File No. ITC-89-020, *See Executive TeleCard, Ltd*, 4 FCC Rcd 367 (1989), and the authorization it acquired from IDX International in 1998, File No. ITC-98-496-AL, 13 FCC Rcd 15632 (1998). Trans Global is authorized to provide facilities-based international services pursuant to its Section 214 authorization granted in File No. ITC-97-437, 13 FCC Rcd 5944 (1997).

(e) The Applicants request authority for the assignment of the Section 214 authorization held by Trans Global to eGlobe pursuant to the terms and conditions of Section 63.18(e)(5) of the Commission's Rules.

(f) No response required.

(g) No response required

(h) Merger Sub is a wholly-owned subsidiary of eGlobe created for the purpose of merging with Trans Global. eGlobe has no shareholders with an interest of 10 percent or greater.

(i) eGlobe has subsidiaries that are authorized to provide international telecommunications services in Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore and Japan. In Hong Kong, Worldwide 800 Services (Hong Kong) Limited holds Public Non-Exclusive Telecommunications Service Licences to provide international callback service and international value-added network services. In Taiwan, Orlida International holds a license as a General Type II Telecom Service Vendor. In Singapore, IDX Singapore Pte Ltd. holds a Store-and-Forward VAN License. In Japan, eGlobe, S.A. (Turks and Caicos) holds a license as a General Type II Telecom Service Vendor.

(j) eGlobe provides international telecommunications services by resale to four countries in which it is affiliated with a foreign carrier, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore and Japan.

(k) All the countries in which eGlobe is affiliated with a foreign carrier and provides international telecommunications services are WTO members.

(l) No foreign carrier with which eGlobe is affiliated has monopoly power in a market in which eGlobe provides service, or has market power sufficient to affect competition adversely in the U.S. market.

(m) eGlobe's subsidiaries that are authorized to provide service in Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore and Japan do not own any telecommunications facilities in those countries and do not have market power that would affect competition adversely in the United States market. Accordingly, eGlobe is a non-dominant carrier for purposes of

Section 63.10 of the Commission's Rules.

(n) eGlobe hereby certifies that it has not agreed to accept special concessions directly or indirectly from any foreign carrier or administration with respect to traffic or revenue flows between the United States and any foreign country which eGlobe may serve under the authority granted under this part, and will not enter into such agreements in the future.

(o) eGlobe and Trans Global hereby certify that no party to this application, as defined in Section 1.2002(b) of the Commission's Rules, is subject to denial of Federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 862.

(p) The instant application is being submitted under the procedures set forth in Section 63.12 of the Commission's Rules. Neither party to this application: (1) has an affiliation within the meaning of Section 63.09 of the Commission's Rules with a foreign carrier that operates in a non-WTO destination market or has market power in a destination market; (2) has an affiliation within the meaning of Section 63.09 of the Commission's Rules with a dominant U.S. facilities-based carrier whose international switched services will be resold; or (3) seeks authority to resell private lines to a country for which the Commission has not previously authorized the provision of switched services over private lines. Accordingly, the transfer should be deemed granted on the 15th day after the date of public notice listing the instant application as accepted for filing, unless the application is formally opposed or the Commission informs the parties in writing within 14 days of the public notice that this application is not eligible for streamlined processing under Section 63.12 of the Commission's Rules.

IV. CONCLUSION

The Applicants respectfully request that the Commission authorize the assignment described herein.
