Sumita,  
Per our discussion:

(1) You asked about which states the assets are located in that are involved in the Business being transferred from Acceris to First. I confirmed that the relevant assets/customers are in all the contiguous 48 states, plus Hawaii and the District of Columbia, but not Alaska.

(2) Regarding the international 214 licenses. Acceris has a facilities-based license because it has international switches. First has a resale only international 214 license because it does not have international switches. The Business being acquired by First does not involve switches used for international traffic -- the Business is resale only -- so First's resale 214 license is sufficient.
