ASTAC Long Distance LLC, by its attorneys and pursuant to Section 63.21(i) of the Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC” or “Commission”), hereby notifies the Commission of a change in the name of the entity providing international telecommunications service pursuant to the above-referenced Section 214 authorization held by its parent, Arctic Slope Telephone Association Cooperative, Inc. (“ASTAC”). The entity has changed its name from ASTAC Long Distance, Inc. (“ASTAC-LD, Inc.”) to ASTAC Long Distance LLC (“ASTAC-LD LLC”).

The above-referenced authorization was originally issued to ASTAC-LD, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of ASTAC. ASTAC-LD, Inc. provided international resale service pursuant to this authorization. In 2008, ASTAC-LD, Inc. completed a pro forma assignment of the international Section 214 authorization to ASTAC, its parent (File No. ITC-ASG-20080104-00005). However, service continued to be provided by ASTAC-LD, Inc. under the authority of its parent.

On January 3, 2012, ASTAC-LD, Inc. converted to a limited liability company, and its name was changed to ASTAC-LD LLC. The conversion did not involve the liquidation of one company and the recapitalization of another, but rather allowed ASTAC-LD, Inc. to convert from one type of organizational structure to another as a matter of state law. Under Alaska law, a wholly owned corporate subsidiary may convert to an Alaskan limited liability company. *See* Alaska Statutes Section 10.50.570(i). Under that law, upon the filing with the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development of the Application for Certificate of Conversion (filed on January 3, 2012), “the existence of the limited liability company is considered to have commenced on the date the other entity commenced its existence.” Accordingly, ASTAC-LD LLC remains the same legal entity, both prior to and following the conversion. Because ASTAC-LD, Inc. is now operating as an LLC rather than a

corporation, and has changed its name accordingly, this filing seeks to update the Commission's records to reflect this name change.
