Answer to Question 13

This filing notifies the Commission pursuant to Section 63.24(f) of its rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.24(f), of the *pro forma* assignment of international Section 214 authorizations held by PRTLD to PRT. Previously, PRT and PRTLD were both wholly owned subsidiaries of Telecomunicaciones de Puerto Rico, Inc. On August 1, 2011, PRTLD was merged into PRT, and PRTLD ceased to exist. Consequently, all of the authorizations previously held by PRTLD are now held by PRT.

This change constitutes a *pro forma* assignment because this is "an assignment from a corporation to a corporation owned or controlled by the assignor stockholders without substantial change in their interests," since ultimate control of the Section 214 authorizations has not changed. The Commission previously approved the ultimate ownership of these Section 214 authorizations, and this ownership remains unchanged. The Commission has stated that "[r]egulatory review of [*pro forma*] transactions yields no significant public interest benefits, but may delay or hinder transactions that could provide substantial financial, operational, or administrative benefits for carriers."

On December 23, 2010, the Commission granted a waiver of Section 64.1903 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 64.1903, allowing PRT and PRTLD to merge. See Petition of Puerto Rico Telephone Company, Inc. and Puerto Rico Telephone Larga Distancia, Inc. for Waiver of Section 64.1903 of the Commission's Rules, Memorandum Opinion and Order, 25 FCC Rcd 17704 (2010).
