Assignor converted from a Delaware corporation to a Delaware limited liability company on October 3, 2012 resulting in the assignment of Assignor's International Section 214

Authorization to Assignee. The conversion was completed by filing a certificate of conversion and did not entail a merger or other transaction that extinguished the existence of Assignor. As such, Assignee is the same entity as Assignor, except that it is a limited liability company rather than a corporation.
