eKit.com, Inc. (“eKit” or “Company”), through its undersigned attorney, hereby requests modification of its international Section 214 authorizations. eKit previously received authority under Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, to provide international switched services on a facilities-based (Section 63.18(e)(1)) and resale basis (Section 63.18(e)(2)) under File No. ITC-214-20060810-00384 (granted January 9, 2007).

Specifically, eKit respectfully requests the surrender of all international Section 214 authorizations on the route from the U.S. to the Bailiwick of Jersey (“Jersey”) except for the Company’s authorization under Section 63.18(e)(2) to provide international service on the Jersey route solely through the resale of unaffiliated U.S. facilities-based carriers’ international switched services. The Company does not request modification of its international Section 214 authorizations on any other international route.

By retaining only its Section 63.18(e)(2) authorization on the U.S. to Jersey route, eKit further requests to be presumptively classified as non-dominant on the route after consummation of a pending transfer of control transaction despite the fact that it will gain an affiliation with a foreign carrier that has market power in Jersey.<sup>1</sup> Since eKit intends to provide international switched services to Jersey solely through the resale (either directly or indirectly) of unaffiliated U.S. facilities-based carriers’ international switched services, the Company qualifies for a presumption of non-dominance under the Section 63.10(a)(4) of the Commission’s rules.<sup>2</sup>


