Dear Mr. Dortch:

Townes Telecommunications, Inc. ("Townes"), by its attorneys, hereby requests the Commission modify its above-referenced authorization to remove the condition requiring compliance with the Letter of Assurance dated May 6, 2005.¹ As described in greater detail below, the authorization has since been transferred to Townes, a corporation 100% owned by U.S. citizen shareholders and, as such, the Letter of Assurance condition is no longer necessary.

On May 6, 2005, Pymatuning Holding Company, Inc. (PHC) entered into an agreement with the U.S. Departments of Justice and Homeland Security and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (collectively "USG Agencies") in order to address national security, law enforcement and public safety concerns relating to PHC's 2005 transfer of control application with the Federal Communications Commission. In 2009, Pymatuning Independent Telephone Company (PITC) filed an application with the FCC to transfer control from Pymatuning Holding Company (PHC) to Townes. PHC retained no interest in PITC and Townes is a corporation

100% owned by U.S. citizen shareholders. As such, the USG Agencies have indicated they would have no objection to removing the 2005 Letter of Assurances as a condition on the FCC authorization.
