AT&T Mobility Puerto Rico Inc. (“AMPR”) hereby seeks Commission approval to modify the international Section 214 authorization to operate over the Americas-II cable system, **File No. ITC-214-19980430-00923** (the “License”), to remove AMPR as one of co-licensees for this international Section 214 authorization.

This license permits AMPR to acquire and operate capacity in the Americas-II submarine cable system. AMPR also has filed an application to modify the Americas-II submarine cable landing license, File No. SCL-LIC-19980429-00019, to relinquish AMPR’s interest in that license. As is explained in more detail in that application, AMPR has conveyed its rights and obligations under the Americas-II Cable System Construction and Maintenance Agreement (“C&MA”) to AT&T Corp., which, like AMPR, is a wholly owned subsidiary of AT&T Inc. AT&T Corp. already is a co-licensee of the License.

AT&T Inc. has now agreed to sell AMPR to Liberty Latin America Ltd.¹ As AMPR no longer will be affiliated with AT&T Corp. once that transaction closes, AMPR has decided the time is ripe to remove itself as one of the co-licensees for File No. ITC-214-19980430-00923.

Accordingly, the Commission should grant this application to modify the international Section 214 authorization and remove AMPR as a co-licensee.
