On behalf of Empresa Nacional de Telecomunicaciones S.A. ("ENTEL-Chile") and STET International Netherlands N.V. ("STET") (together "Applicants"), please find an original and six (6) copies of an application for Commission approval to **transfer control of the international Section 214 authorization of Americatel Corporation** ("Americatel") from ENTEL-Chile to STET. A Form 159 and a check in the amount of \$815.00 to cover the filing fee are also enclosed. Please note that the Applicants will file STET's original certification to replace STET's enclosed faxed certification as soon as possible.

Concurrent with this application, Applicants are also filing applications to transfer control of Americatel's domestic Section 214 authorization and cable landing license. change, Americatel will continue to provide services to its existing customers under existing service arrangements, pursuant to its Section 214 authority granted by the Commission. The proposed Transaction, therefore, will be virtually transparent to Americatel's customers. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is a chart that illustrates the corporate structure of the parties immediately following consummation of the proposed transfer of control.

Applicants respectfully request streamlined, expedited treatment of this application pursuant to Section 63.12 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.12, for the reasons stated below.

As a result of the transaction, Americatel will become affiliated, within the meaning of Section 63.09(e) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.09(e), with several foreign carriers authorized to provide telecommunications services, including Telecom Italia, Telecom Argentina S.A. ("Telecom Argentina"), Telekom Austria A.G. ("Telekom Austria"), Brasil Telecom Participacoes S.A. (formerly, Tele Centro Sul Participacoes S.A.) ("Brasil Telecom"), Entel S.A. ("Entel-Bolivia"), Empresa de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba S.A. ("Empresa de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba"), Intelcom San Marino S.p.A. ("Intelcom San Marino"), and Telekom Serbia A.D. ("Telekom Serbia"). Given that Intelcom San Marino and Telekom Serbia are dominant carriers in countries that are not Members of the World Trade Organization ("WTO"), Americatel will discontinue offering service on the US-San Marino and US-Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) routes. Americatel reserves the right later to seek approval to provide service on these routes. However, because Telecom Italia, Telecom Argentina, Telekom Austria, Brasil Telecom, Entel-Bolivia, and Empresa

de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba are dominant carriers in countries that are Members of the WTO, Americatel accepts dominant carrier classification with respect to the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia and US-Cuba routes, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date. Americatel also will acquire several other foreign affiliates as a result of the Transaction,<sup>1</sup> but none of them are dominant providers of telecommunications services in a relevant market in a destination country. Therefore, Americatel lacks sufficient market power on the foreign end of these routes to affect competition adversely in the U.S. telecommunications market. Accordingly, given that Americatel: (1) will discontinue offering international service on the US-San Marino and US-Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) routes; (2) accepts dominant carrier classification on the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia and US-Cuba routes; and (3) qualifies for the presumption of non-dominance under Section 63.10(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.10(a)(3), with respect to its other potential foreign affiliates, this application is eligible for streamlined processing.

**I. THE PARTIES**

**A. Empresa Nacional de Telecomunicaciones S.A.**

ENTEL-Chile, a corporation organized under the laws of Chile with headquarters in Santiago, Chile, is one of the largest long distance carriers in Chile and a pioneer in the privatization of Latin America's telecommunications industry. ENTEL-Chile holds a 100 percent ownership interest in ENTEL International B.V.I. Corp., which in turn holds an 80 percent ownership interest in Americatel. ENTEL-Chile is not a dominant carrier.

In fact, the Commission has expressly determined that "ENTTEL-Chile has no control over bottleneck services or facilities that can be used to discriminate against unaffiliated U.S. carriers terminating traffic in Chile." (See FCC File No. ISP-96-002 at ¶ 11.)

Americatel, ENTEL-Chile's indirect subsidiary, is a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Delaware with offices at 4045 NW 97<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Miami, Florida 33178. Serving the needs of customers with connections to the Latin American and Caribbean regions, Americatel provides international and domestic long distance services, including casual calling (*i.e.*, "dial around") service, prepaid calling card service and Internet services. Americatel is authorized to provide U.S. international service pursuant to its Section 214 authorization. In addition, Americatel provides domestic interexchange service pursuant to blanket Section 214 authority and provides domestic intrastate service pursuant to its various state authorizations.

**B. STET International Netherlands N.V.**

STET is a corporation organized under the laws of The Netherlands with offices at Strawinskylaan Atrium 6 Floor, 1077 ZX Amsterdam, The Netherlands. STET is a wholly owned subsidiary of Telecom Italia S.p.A. ("Telecom Italia"), one of the world's largest fixed telecommunications operators, which is incorporated as a joint stock company under the laws of Italy. In addition to its wireline operations, Telecom Italia, through its subsidiary Telecom Italia Mobile S.p.A., is also one of the largest mobile telecommunications operators in Europe. With significant international telecommunications investments in Europe and Latin America, Telecom Italia and its subsidiaries also provide data services, satellite telecommunications services, and information technology software and services. Telecom Italia indirectly holds Section

214 authorization through two affiliates: Telecom Italia of North America, Inc. (See FCC File No. ITC-214-20000523-00313) and Telemedia International USA, Inc. ("Telemedia") (See FCC File Nos. ITC-214-19991227-00818, ITC-95-587).

## **II. THE TRANSACTION**

Americatel is a subsidiary of ENTEL B.V.I., a company organized under the laws of the British Virgin Islands, which in turn, is a wholly-owned subsidiary of ENTEL-Chile, a domestic and international long distance carrier in Chile organized under the laws of Chile.

Through a stock purchase agreement, STET, which currently owns a 26.16 percent voting interest in ENTEL-Chile, will acquire an additional 25.63 percent voting interest in ENTEL-Chile from Chilquinta Telecomunicaciones S.A. (10.62 percent) and Chilquinta S.A. (15.01 percent). STET also will acquire 2.9789 percent of ENTEL-Chile's shares from some of the minority shareholders. As a result of the Transaction, STET will hold a controlling interest of 54.76 percent in ENTEL-Chile. Therefore, STET will acquire an indirect controlling interest in Americatel once the Transaction is consummated. Accordingly, Applicants request authority for this transfer of control.

## **III. PUBLIC INTEREST CONSIDERATIONS**

Approval of the proposed Transaction will serve the public interest. As a result of the proposed Transaction, Americatel will be backed by an entity (Telecom Italia) that has the management experience, workforce and means that will strengthen Americatel's ability to bring competitive integrated telecommunications services to consumers in the United States. The proposed Transaction will allow Americatel to manage its telecommunications operations more efficiently, thereby permitting greater investment in

facilities, customer service and technological innovation. As a result, the Transaction will result in a company better equipped to accelerate its growth as a competitive telecommunications service provider. In addition, the proposed Transaction will be consummated in a seamless fashion, will be transparent to customers and will not in any way inconvenience or cause harm to any of Americatel's customers.

- (d) Licensee: Americatel has received authority under Section 214 of the Act as a non-dominant international facilities-based carrier and reseller. (See FCC File Nos. ITC-214-19970312-00146, ITC-214-19970421-00220, ITC-96-263, ITC-94-514, ITC-94-321, ITC-93-160-TC, ITC-92-166, and ITC-92-165.)

Transferor: ENTEL-Chile has not previously received authority under Section 214 of the Act.

Transferee: STET has not previously received authority under Section 214 of the Act. However, two of STET's affiliates have received authority under Section 214 of the Act. They include Telecom Italia North America, Inc. ("TINA") (See FCC File No. ITC-214-20000523-00313.) and Telemedia International USA, Inc. ("Telemedia") (See FCC File Nos. ITC-214-19991227-00818 and ITC-95-587.)

- (e) By this Application, Applicants seek authority to transfer control of Americatel, a non-dominant common carrier holding international Section 214 authority, from ENTEL-Chile to STET.

(i) STET certifies that it is not a foreign carrier within the meaning of 63.09(d) of the Commission's Rules. However, STET is affiliated within the meaning of Section 63.09 (e) of the Commission's Rules with several foreign carriers. Section (f) of this Application provides the countries in which STET has a dominant telecommunications foreign affiliate, and Exhibit B provides the countries in which STET has a non-dominant foreign affiliate.

(j) STET certifies that it, through Americatel, seeks to provide international telecommunications services to several countries in which it has an affiliation with a foreign carrier as described in Section 63.18(j) of the Commission's Rules. Section (f) of this Application provides the countries in which STET has a dominant telecommunications foreign affiliate, and Exhibit B provides the countries in which STET has a non-dominant foreign affiliate.

(k) The foreign carriers listed in Section (l) of this Application and in Section B of this Application are based in countries that are Members of the World Trade Organization.

(l) STET, through Americatel, may resell international switched services of unaffiliated U.S. carriers in order to provide telecommunications services to other countries where STET has foreign carrier affiliations. As demonstrated below, Americatel will comply with dominant carrier treatment to those countries in which it is affiliated with a dominant foreign carrier.

Americatel also will become affiliated with Intelcom San Marino, the dominant carrier operating in San Marino and Telekom Serbia, the dominant carrier operating in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro). Because Intelcom San Marino and Telekom Serbia are the current incumbents in non-WTO Member countries, Americatel does not seek to provide international service on the US-San Marino and US-Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) routes. However, Americatel reserves the right to seek such authorization from the Commission in the future.

STET submits that Brasil Telecom is dominant with respect to the local and long distance sector in Southern Brazil. With the exception of Brasil Telecom, the Commission's *List of Foreign Telecommunications Carriers that are Presumed to Possess Market Power in Foreign Telecommunications Markets*, released June 18, 1999, deems the foreign carriers listed above as dominant foreign carriers. Accordingly, STET agrees to have Americatel classified as dominant with respect to the **US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba and US-Italy** routes, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date. Accordingly, Americatel, will file quarterly traffic reports pursuant to Section 43.61(c) of the Commission's Rules with respect to these routes.

**Other Foreign Affiliations:**

With the exception of the US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-Italy, US-San Marino, US-Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) routes, STET submits that Americatel should be classified as non-dominant pursuant to Section 63.10(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules. None of the STET affiliates identified in Exhibit B, nor Americatel's existing foreign carrier affiliates, are listed on the Commission's *List of Foreign Telecommunications Carriers that are Presumed to Possess Market Power in Foreign Telecommunications Markets*, released June 18, 1999. In addition, these foreign affiliates are relatively new market entrants offering services in competition with dominant foreign carriers and others. At this time, these Americatel foreign affiliates each hold significantly less than a 50 percent market share in the international transport and local access markets in the countries where they operate. Moreover, these foreign affiliates do not have the ability to discriminate against unaffiliated U.S. international carriers through the control of bottleneck services or facilities to exercise market power in the countries where they operate. Accordingly, Americatel's foreign affiliates lack sufficient market power on these U.S.-international routes to affect competition adversely in the U.S. market. Therefore, with the exception of the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-San Marino, US-Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) routes, STET agrees that Americatel should be presumptively classified as non-dominant carriers on all international routes.

(m) Please refer to Section (l) above.

(n) Neither STET nor Americatel has agreed to accept special concessions, as defined in Section 63.14(b) of the Commission's Rules, directly or indirectly, from any foreign carrier where the foreign carrier possesses market power on the foreign end of the route and will not enter into such agreements in the future.

(o) STET certifies, pursuant to Sections 1.2001 through 1.2003 of the Commission's Rules (implementing the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 853a), that no party to this Application is subject to a denial of Federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

(p) This Application qualifies for streamlined processing pursuant to Section 63.12(c)(1)(v) of the Commission's Rules. As set forth above in Section (l), STET agrees to have Americatel classified as a dominant carrier with respect to the US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-Italy routes, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date. Moreover, given that STET's new foreign affiliates in San Marino and the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia

and Montenegro), two non-WTO Member countries, are dominant, STET agrees that Americatel will not provide international service on the US-San Marino and US-Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) routes upon grant of this application. In addition, Applicants qualify for streamlined processing pursuant to Section 63.12(c)(1)(ii) of the Commission's Rules, because, as set forth above in Section (I), Americatel qualifies for the presumption of non-dominance under Section 63.10(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules with respect to its other foreign affiliations.

#### V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, Empresa Nacional de Telecomunicaciones S.A. and STET International Netherlands N.V., respectfully submit that the public interest, convenience and necessity would be furthered by grant of this application for authority to transfer indirect control of Americatel from ENTEL-Chile to STET.





**Post-Closing**

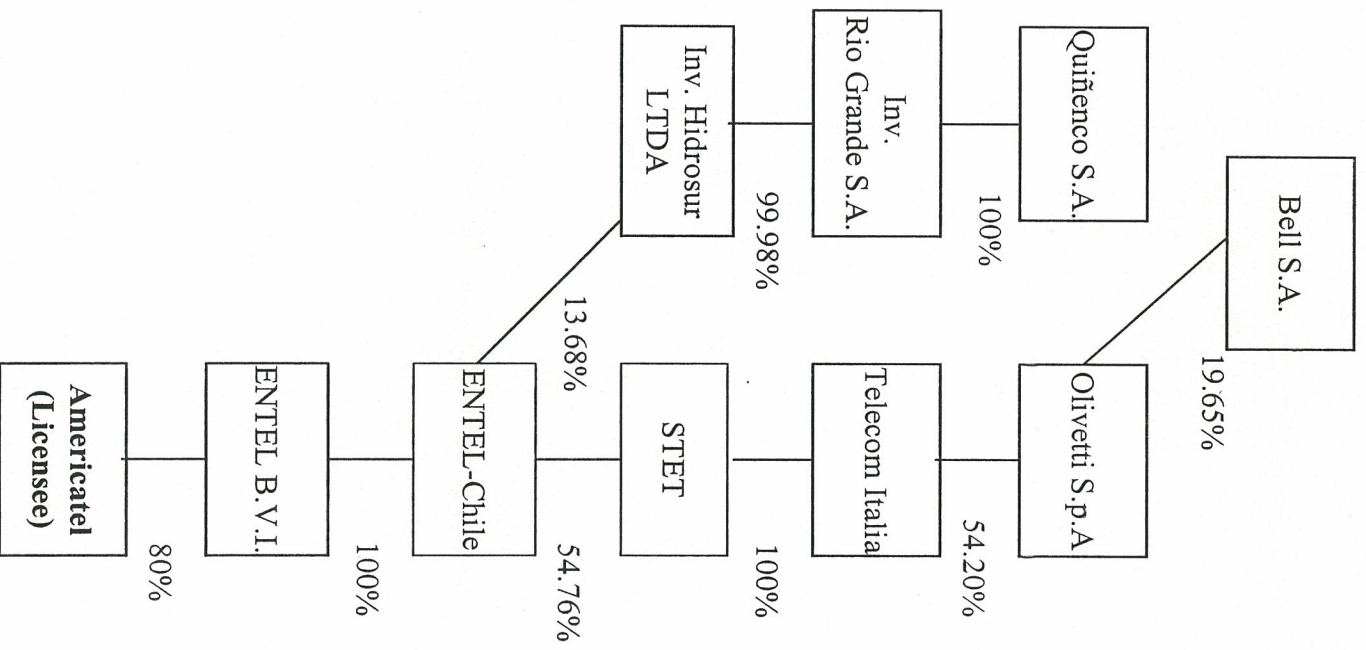

Americatel, Centroamerica and Orbitel are therefore under common control of ENTEL-Chile. Centroamerica is not itself a foreign carrier, however, Centroamerica holds controlling interests in three foreign carriers, Americatel El Salvador S.A. de C.V., Americatel Guatemala, S.A., and Americatel Honduras, S.A.
