PETITION TO ADOPT CONDITIONS TO AUTHORIZATIONS AND LICENSES

The United States Department of Justice ("DOJ"), including the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI"), together with the United States Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") (collectively, the "Agencies"), respectfully submit this Petition to Adopt Conditions to Authorizations and Licenses ("Petition"), pursuant to Section 1.41 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC" or "Commission") rules. ¹ Through this Petition, the Agencies advise the Commission that they have no objection to the Commission granting its consent in the above-referenced proceeding, provided that the Commission conditions the grant on StarVox Communications, Inc., ("StarVox") and Capital Telecommunications, Inc., ("CTI") (together, the "Applicants") abiding by the commitments and undertakings contained in their September 14, 2006 letter to Sigal P. Mandelker, Stewart A. Baker, and Elaine N. Lammert (the "Letter") attached hereto as Exhibit I.

In the above-captioned proceedings, StarVox and CTI propose to transfer control of CTI to StarVox. StarVox and CTI have filed a joint application with the FCC seeking consent for the transfer of control of CTI, holder of domestic and international Section 214 authority, to StarVox.²

As the Commission is aware, the Agencies have taken the position that their ability to satisfy their obligations to protect the national security, enforce the laws, and preserve the safety of the public could be impaired by transactions in which foreign entities will own or operate a part of the U.S. telecommunications system, or in which foreign-located facilities will be used to provide domestic telecommunications services to U.S. customers. After discussions with the Applicants' representatives in connection with the proposed acquisition of CTI by StarVox, the Agencies have concluded that the commitments set forth in the Letter will help ensure that the Agencies and other entities with responsibility for enforcing the law, protecting the national security, and preserving public safety can proceed in a legal, secure, and confidential manner to satisfy these responsibilities. Accordingly, the Agencies hereby advise the Commission that they have no objection to the Commission granting the above-referenced Applications, provided that the Commission conditions its consent on compliance by the Applicants with the commitments set forth in the Letter.

The Agencies are authorized to state that the Applicants do not object to the grant of this Petition.
