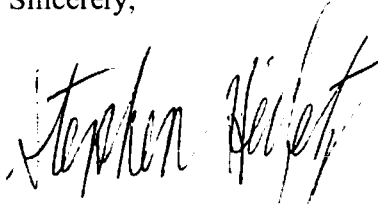
Dear Ms. Dortch:

The Department of Homeland Security ("DHS"), with the concurrence of the Department of Justice ("DOJ") and the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI"), request that the Federal Communications Commission ("Commission") defer action on the applications of StarVox Communications, Inc., Capital Telecommunications, Inc. (CTI), and U.S. Wireless Data, Inc. (together "Applicants") to transfer control of domestic and international section 214 authorizations under section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934 held by CTI and StarVox Communications, Inc. to U.S. Wireless Data, Inc. We ask that the FCC defer these actions until such time as DHS, DOJ, and FBI have completed their ongoing review of these applications and have notified Commission. Necessarily, DHS and FBI also request that the Commission remove the application from streamlined processing.

After receiving notice of the applications, DHS, DOJ, and FBI have been in contact with the Applicant to request information relevant to our review based on national security, law enforcement, and public safety. The company has responded to those requests, but DHS, DOJ, and FBI are still analyzing those responses and are not yet in a position to communicate our position to the FCC. DHS, DOJ, and FBI will conduct their review expeditiously and advise the Commission promptly upon its completion.
