Application for consent to transfer control of Section 214 authorization, ITC-214-20050812-00320, held by HELIO LLC to SK Telecom USA Holdings, Inc. (Transferee). Transferee is 100% owned by a **Korean** Corporation, which, in turn, is 21.75% and 10.50% owned by other two **Korean** corporations, respectively. HELIO and SK Telecom USA confirm that they will continue to honor the commitments set forth in the **January 10, 2006 letter** to the Executive Agencies following consummation of the proposed transaction.

ITC-214-20071016-00424 (e-file)

Pacifictel S.A.'s application for authority to provide resale services between the United States and permissible international points. Applicant is incorporated and located in **Ecuador**. Further, applicant is 100% owned by Fondo de Solidaridad, an autonomous entity created under section 250 of **Ecuador Constitution**. Fondo de Solidaridad also controls Andinatel which is presumed to possess telecommunication marker power in **Ecuador**. Applicant agrees to file the traffic reports required by §43.61(c) of the Commission's rules.
