**PETITION TO ADOPT CONDITIONS TO
AUTHORIZATIONS AND LICENSES**

The Department of Justice (the “Agency”) submits this Petition to Adopt Conditions to Authorizations and Licenses (“Petition”), pursuant to Section 1.41 of the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) rules.¹ Through this Petition, the Agency advises the Commission that it has no objection to the Commission approving the authority sought in the above-referenced proceeding, provided that the Commission conditions its approval on the assurance of eKit.com, Inc. and Jersey Telecom (UK) Limited (collectively, “the Companies”) to abide by the commitments and undertakings set forth in the May 23, 2011 Letter of Assurances (“LOA”), which is attached hereto. In the above-referenced proceeding, the Companies petitioned the Commission for authority to transfer control of eKit.com, Inc. a holder of international authorization under Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, to Jersey Telecom (UK) Limited.

The Commission has long recognized that law enforcement, national security, and public

safety concerns are part of its public interest analysis, and has accorded deference to the views of other U.S. government agencies with expertise in those areas. *See In the Matter of Comsat Corporation d/b/a Comsat Mobile Communications, etc.*, 16 FCC Rcd. 21,661, 21707 ¶ 94 (2001).

After discussions with representatives of the Companies in connection with the above-referenced proceeding, the Agency has concluded that the additional commitments set forth in the LOA will help ensure that the Agency and other entities with responsibility for enforcing the law, protecting the national security, and preserving public safety can proceed appropriately to satisfy those responsibilities. Accordingly, the Agency advises the Commission that it has no objection on those grounds to the Commission granting the above-referenced request for transfer of control, provided that the Commission conditions its consent on compliance by the Companies with the commitments set forth in the LOA.

The Agency is authorized to state that the Companies do not object to the grant of this
Petition.
