DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL 214 TRANSFER OF CONTROL APPLICATION

I. INTRODUCTION

BullsEye Telecom, Inc. ("BullsEye" or "Transferee") and BroadLink Telecom, LLC (BroadLink" or "Transferor") (together "Applicants"), pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. Section 214, and Sections 63.03, 63.04(a), and 63.18 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. Sections 63.03, 63.04(a), and 63.18, hereby request authority to enable BullsEye to acquire certain customers of BroadLink. The proposed transaction will not result in a loss or impairment of service to BroadLink customers that would be affected by the proposed transaction. This application is therefore submitted as a streamlined transfer of control pursuant to Section 63.03 and 63.18 of the Commission's rules.

II. APPLICANTS

Transferee

BullsEye is a Michigan-based certificated local exchange and long distance carrier incorporated in April 3, 2000. BullsEye provides voice, data, wireless and VoIP service in all states except Alaska and Hawaii. The company has international Section 214 Limited Global Facilities-Based and Resale Service authority pursuant to FCC rules (ITC-214-20010306-00118). BullsEye has served small and medium sized business customers as well as large multi-location clients for 14 years.

Transferor

BroadLink is a certificated provider of local, long distance, and data services to business customers in Texas. BroadLink will continue business operations following the transfer.

III. SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED TRANSACTION

Applicants have entered into an Asset Purchase Agreement whereby BullsEye will acquire approximately 1,300 customers of BroadLink in Texas. Following the transaction, these customers will be served by BullsEye. The proposed transfer is subject to Texas customer notification requirements. Applicants emphasize that the transition will be seamless and virtually transparent to the affected customers. Following the transfer, BullsEye will provide long distance and/or local exchange service under the same rates, terms and conditions as the customers currently receive from BroadLink. BroadLink's customers will not incur any charges as a result of the change in service provider to BullsEye.

In accordance with state and Commission rules, Applicants are providing or have provided written notice to affected BroadLink customers informing them of the proposed transaction. Service to these customers will not be transferred until the requisite regulatory approvals have been obtained. In addition, the notice and certification required by Section 64.1120(e) of the Commission's rules have been filed. Applicants seek to consummate the proposed transaction on an expedited basis so that BullsEye may integrate the acquired customers into its existing business in an orderly fashion, and at the same time expand its presence in the Texas market it currently serves. The transfer of customers is expected to be accomplished in stages over the months of October and November, 2013, subject to all required regulatory approvals.

e) Certification

BullsEye and BroadLink each certify pursuant to Sections 1.2001 through 1.2003 of the Commission's rules that no party to this Application is subject to a denial of Federal benefits, as provided in the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. §3301.

f) Geographic Areas Served

BullsEye is certified to provide local and long distance service nationwide except Alaska and Hawaii. BroadLink is certificated and registered to provide local exchange and long distance services in Texas.

g) Streamlined Treatment

Applicants submit that the proposed transaction would result in BullsEye's market share in the local and long distance market to be substantially less than ten percent. BullsEye provides competitive telecommunications and exchange access services exclusively in geographic areas served by a dominant local exchange carrier that is not a party to this transaction. Neither applicant is dominant with respect to any service. Therefore, this Application presumptively qualifies for streamlined processing pursuant to Section 63.03(b)(2)(i) of the Commission's rules.

j) Waiver Requests

Applicants have not filed any waiver requests in conjunction with the proposed transaction.

k) Public Interest Considerations

The proposed transaction will serve the public interest by ensuring no interruption of service or inconvenience to the affected customers, and the affected customers will receive the same rates, terms and conditions of service backed by the support services of BullsEye, a growing and highly competitive carrier. Because BullsEye will provide service to BroadLink's former customers at the same rates, terms and conditions of service as they currently receive from BroadLink, the transaction will be virtually transparent to BroadLink's customers in terms of the service they receive. Moreover, as set forth above, Applicants have provided or will provide written notice of the proposed transaction to ensure that BroadLink customers will understand how the proposed change in service providers will affect them.

- (n) BullsEye certifies that it has not agreed to accept special concessions directly or indirectly from any foreign carrier with respect to any U.S. international route, where the foreign carrier possesses sufficient market power on the foreign end of the route to affect competition adversely in the U.S. market, and will not enter into such agreements in the future.
- (o) BullsEye certifies that neither BullsEye nor any party to this application is subject to a denial of Federal benefits, as provided in the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. 853a.
- (p) BullsEye requests streamlined processing of this application pursuant to Section 63.12. In support of this request, BullsEye states that it is not affiliated with a foreign carrier in a destination market, is not affiliated with a dominant U.S. carrier whose international switched or private line services it plans to resell, nor does it seek authority to provide switched basic services

over private lines to a country for which the Commission has not previously authorized the provision of switched services over private lines.

For these reasons, the grant of this Application is consistent with the public interest.
