On October 20, 2015, James Talbot and I, of AT&T, met with Troy Tanner, Denise Coca, Kimberly Cook, Jodi Cooper, Cara Grayer, David Krech, Walt Strack, and Mark Uretsky of the International Bureau. Eric Loeb and Carol Bourdette, also of AT&T, participated by phone.

During the meeting we discussed recent developments following the dissolution of the International Clearing House (ICH) mechanism in Pakistan and expressed support for the removal of the Stop Settlement Payment Order on the U.S.-Pakistan route.

We also responded to questions from Staff with regard to the proposed merger of Cable & Wireless Communications Plc and Columbus International, Inc. and provided general information on AT&T's commercial arrangements to terminate traffic in Haiti and Jamaica.
