Vocus Group Limited

On August 31, 2021, the Chair of the Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Services Sector (Committee) requested that the Commission defer action on the application for an international section 214 authorization filed by Vocus Group Limited while the Committee reviews the application for any national security and law enforcement concerns that may be raised by foreign participation in the United States telecommunications services sector. Pursuant to Executive Order 13913 (85 Fed Reg 19643 (April 8, 2020)), the Chair will notify the Commission when the Chair has determined that the 120-day initial review period has begun.

Five9, Inc.

On August 27, 2021, the Department of Justice, on behalf of the Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Service Sector (Committee), notified the Commission that it is reviewing the domestic and international transfer of control applications for the proposed acquisition of Five9, Inc. by Zoom Video Communications, Inc. (see Domestic Section 214 Application Filed For The Transfer Of Control Of Five9, Inc. To Zoom Video Communications, Inc., WC Docket No. 21-316, Public Notice, DA-21-982 (WCB rel. Aug. 10, 2021)) for national security issues and requests that the Commission defer action on the application until it completes its review.

Through this Public Notice, pursuant to Commission practice, the transfer of control applications are being referred to the Committee for its views on any national security or law enforcement concerns related to the application. See Process Reform for Executive Branch Review of Certain FCC Applications and Petitions Involving Foreign Ownership, IB Docket 16-155, Report and Order, 35 FCC Red 10927 (2020).
