Communications Satellite Corporation ("COMSAT"), through its World Systems Division, hereby submits comments on the above-referenced "Application" filed by STARSYS, Inc. ("STARSYS"). STARSYS proposes to construct, launch and operate a system of 24 satellites to be distributed randomly on 50 to 60 degree inclined planes in circular orbits approximately 1,300 kilometers above the earth.

comsat does not oppose the Application. However, to the extent that STARSYS provides international communications services, we submit that STARSYS would be subject to the same policies and conditions as apply to U.S. separate systems.

are contemplated, STARSYS would be obliged to comply with the notification procedures set forth in Article 8 of the Inmarsat convention.
