On December 2, 2004, Carson Agnew, Dick Evans, and Lon Levin of Mobile Satellite Ventures LP ("MSV LP"), and the undersigned, on behalf of MSV LP, met with William Bell, Robert Nelson, Cassandra Thomas, and Tom Tycz of the International Bureau to discuss MSV's above-referenced pending satellite application. In particular, MSV described the current effort to work with Mobile Satellite Ventures (Canada) Inc., its Canadian partner, and Industry Canada, the Canadian regulator, to harmonize the design of their respective next-generation satellites. As with the current generation satellites, it is anticipated that the two satellites will be identical and will provide in-orbit redundancy for each other. MSV proposed to report back to the Bureau by mid-January.
