

Dear Ms. Dortch:

By this letter, Lockheed Martin Corporation ("Lockheed Martin"), in accordance with the authorization granted by the Commission, informs the Commission that Lockheed Martin's LM-RPS-2 radionavigation-satellite service satellite, Call Sign S2371, has been successfully launched and placed into operation at the 107.3° W.L. orbital location. Lockheed Martin confirms that the operations of the satellite fully conform to the terms and conditions of the underlying authorization. *See Lockheed Martin Corp., DA 05-2424 (Int'l. Bur., released September 8, 2005).* Accordingly, the 15-year license term for this space station should begin today, with an expiration date of November 2, 2021.
