Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 10, 2005, the International Bureau ("Bureau") issued a decision authorizing Mobile Satellite Ventures Subsidiary LLC ("MSV") to launch and operate an L-band Mobile Satellite Service ("MSS") satellite at 63.5°WL.<sup>1</sup> Paragraph 54 of this decision requires MSV to submit a written statement by March 11, 2005 identifying any known satellites located at, or planned to be located at, the 63.5°WL orbital location, or assigned in the vicinity of that location, such that the station keeping volume of the satellites might overlap, and that states the measures that will be taken to prevent in-orbit collisions with such satellites.

In accordance with this requirement, MSV hereby states that it is not aware of any other FCC- or non-FCC-licensed satellites that are operational or planned to be deployed at or near the 63.5°WL orbital location whose station-keeping volume would overlap with that of MSV's satellite at the 63.5°WL orbital location.
