New Skies Satellites B.V. ("New Skies") hereby notifies the Commission that on July 2, 2012, it initiated the redeployment of the NSS-5 satellite under Netherlands authority from the 20° W.L. orbital location to another orbital location from which there is no coverage of United States territory. The NSS-5 satellite has been replaced by the NSS-7 satellite at 20° W.L., and all customer traffic has been successfully transitioned to that satellite. Please update your records accordingly.
