Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 10, 2018 the last remaining Dove satellite (a member of a block of satellites known as Flock-2e<sup>3</sup>) deployed from the International Space Station (ISS) into a 400 km 51.6 deg. inclination orbit (i.e. ISS orbit) has re-entered the atmosphere. There are no longer any Flock satellites<sup>1</sup> in the ISS orbit at this time as previously authorized<sup>2</sup>.
