Re: Notice of Oral *Ex Parte* Presentation, Application of Intelsat License LLC to Launch and Operate Intelsat 33e, a Replacement Satellite with New Frequencies, at 60.0° E.L., File No. SAT-LOA-20150327-00016 (Call Sign S2939)

Dear Ms. Dortch:

In accordance with Section 1.1206 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("Commission") rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, this letter notifies the Commission that on November 12, 2015, Susan Crandall and Hazem Moakkit, of Intelsat, and Jen Hindin of Wiley Rein LLP and counsel for Intelsat, met with Jose Albuquerque, Karl Kensinger, Joseph Hill, Kathyrn Medley, Jay Whaley, and Stephen Duall of the International Bureau ("Bureau") to discuss the above-referenced pending application to launch and operate Intelsat 33e ("IS 33e"), a replacement satellite with new frequencies at 60.0° E.L. Specifically, the parties reviewed the frequency bands on the IS 33e satellite and intended geographic service area for each band and discussed ITU filing and coordination matters associated with the satellite payloads.

With respect to ITU filing and coordination matters, Intelsat reminded the Bureau that Intelsat's initial application indicated that IS 33e would utilize ITU filings of the Administration of the United Kingdom and the Administration of Papua New Guinea for the satellite's operations in the 11700-12200 MHz and 17300-17800 MHz frequency bands, and sought the United States' non-objection to the use of these filings. Intelsat requested that, in addition to issuing a non-objection letter, the Commission submit U.S. ITU filings to support IS 33e. Intelsat noted that these filings would be coordinated with the United Kingdom and Papua New Guinea filings identified in the pending application.

Intelsat also discussed the coordination of its Papua New Guinea filing with a higher priority foreign ITU filing and the fact that the coordination agreement could be amended in the future to provide IS 33e additional operational flexibility.
