On March 22, 2016, Harrison Caudill, Jonathan Rosenblatt, and Spiro Sarris, each of Spire Global, Inc. (“Spire”), and Trey Hanbury and Tony Lin, counsel for Spire, participated in a conference call with Karl Kensinger, Deputy Division Chief of the International Bureau (“Bureau”) Satellite Division. Spire requested that the Bureau modify the recent partial grant of the above application<sup>1</sup> to include additional authority for data downlink and telemetry, tracking and command (or TT&C) transmissions in the 402-403 MHz band (space-to-Earth), as requested in the application.<sup>2</sup>
