Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 22, 2005, David Wilson, President of Spectrum Five LLC ("Spectrum Five"), met with Chairman Kevin Martin and his Legal Advisor, Sam Feder. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss Spectrum Five's pending Petition for Declaratory Ruling to provide DBS service in the United States using a satellite system authorized by the Netherlands.¹ Spectrum Five described its proposed system, reviewed the public interest benefits associated with its service (including the significant expansion of spectrum capacity that could be used to provide local-into-local and high-definition television services), and urged prompt grant of the Petition. Spectrum Five also discussed the potential for successful coordination with U.S. DBS operators.
