We understand that you are seeking confirmation about certain matters relating to the IOMSAT-11 and IOMSAT-11A network filings made by the United Kingdom at the ITU on behalf of the Isle of Man Government.

The Government of the Isle of Man has an arrangement with ManSat Ltd that provides ManSat Ltd the right to implement satellite networks using these filings, or to allow a third party to do so. We have been informed that ManSat Ltd has, pursuant to that arrangement, agreed to terms under which ViaSat, Inc. or one of its affiliates may implement satellite networks using these filings, principally to serve the United States

The Government of the Isle of Man does not issue licenses to construct or operate satellites; however, a licence granted by the British National Space Centre under the Outer Space Act 1986 may need to be obtained before the date of the planned launch of the satellite.
