Star One C3 – Letter of Intent Response to Question 36

On October 13, 2010, the International Bureau issued a decision declaring the Permitted List authority for the Star One C5 satellite null and void for failure to comply with applicable milestones, rejecting Star One's request to modify its C5 Permitted List authority by substituting the Star One B1 satellite in its place at 68° W.L. *See Petition for Modification to the Declaratory Ruling Adding Star One C5 to the Permitted List*, Order, File Nos. SAT-PPL-20071113-00159, SAT-PPL-20081205-00225 (rel. Oct. 13, 2010). For reasons set forth in its Application for Review, Star One has appealed this ruling. *See* Star One, S.A., *Application for Review*, File Nos. SAT-PPL-20071113-00159, SAT-PPL-20081205-00225 (filed Nov. 12, 2010). The appeal is still pending before the Commission.
