**Re: Hughes Petition concerning Inmarsat Hawaii Inc. Letter of intent
(IBFS File No. SAT-LOI-20140326-00034, Call Sign S2923)**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On 9 June 2014, HNS License Sub, LLC (“Hughes”) filed a Petition regarding the Letter of Intent submitted by from Inmarsat Hawaii Inc. (“Inmarsat”) to operate a Ka band satellite at 63 WL.¹ The Petition identifies the fact that in its application to operate at 63 WL, Inmarsat included maximum power levels at the antenna flange of its earth stations that could lead to adjacent satellite interference greater than those specified in Section 25.138(a) of the Commission’s Rules.

In its response to the Hughes Petition,² Inmarsat indicates that the higher power levels are only to be used during faded conditions and that the limits in 25.138(a) would be met in clear sky conditions. On that basis, Hughes withdraws its Petition.
