

On September 21, 2004, representatives of Inmarsat participated in a combined meeting and teleconference with International Bureau members Paul Locke, Sean O'More, Bob Nelson and Chip Fleming to discuss technical issues associated with the FCC's preliminary test plan for the proposed testing of Inmarsat terminals in the context of these proceedings. Techniques for measuring susceptibility to intermodulation product interference were discussed as well as the proposed reference signal levels and proposed bit error rates for the tests.
