Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 8, 2004, Lon Levin and Peter Karabinis of Mobile Satellite Ventures LP ("MSV"), and the undersigned, on behalf of MSV, met with James Ball, William Bell, Richard Engelman, John Martin, Robert Nelson, David Strickland, Cassandra Thomas, and Thomas Tycz of the International Bureau to discuss MSV's operation of an Ancillary Terrestrial Component ("ATC") in the L-band.¹ The discussion focused on clarification of certain aspects of the Bureau's decision granting MSV ATC authority,² MSV's need for increased flexibility with respect to terrestrial reuse of L-band spectrum, and MSV's need for relaxation in limits on base station EIRP and PFD. The substance of the positions expressed by MSV is set forth in its filings and *ex parte* submissions in the record of this proceeding.
