Dear Ms. Dortch,

The administration of Colombia as a Notifying Administration to the International Telecommunication Union for matters relating to the position 67° W.L. and on behalf of the member countries of the Andean Community, Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador and Peru, provides this letter in support of the above-referenced applications by SES Americom, Inc. ("SES Americom") for authority to relocate the AMC-4 satellite to 67° W.L. and operate it there in the Ku-band pursuant to the International Telecommunication Union ("ITU") filings of the Colombian Administration, as Notifying Administration for the Andean Community.

As described in the applications, the Andean Community, whose members are Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru, has granted SES Americom's affiliate, New Skies Satellites B.V. ("New Skies"), exclusive authorization for commercial utilization of the 67° W.L. orbital location for a thirty-year term.¹ New Skies has advised the Andean Community that it has arranged with SES Americom for deployment of AMC-4 to 67° W.L. for use under the New Skies authorization from the Andean Community.

The Andean Community hereby confirms that it understands that during its proposed operations at 67° W.L., AMC-4 will remain under the operational control of SES Americom
