¹ 47 C.F.R. § 25.283. Eutelsat was granted a waiver of Section 25.283(c) (Grant, ICFS File No. SAT-PDR-20191017-00115, condition no. 17) because the Astrium Eurostar Spacebus 3000 spacecraft was not designed to vent all its pressurized systems. Following the launch of the spacecraft on March 15, 2004, the helium pressurant tank was permanently sealed by firing pyrotechnic valves on March 22, 2004, and as a result cannot be safely vented. After passivation of all other elements, 1.5 kilograms of helium remain in the 178-liter tank.
