I write on behalf of Satelites Mexicanos, S.A. de C.V. ("Satmex") to request that the FCC add the following Satmex satelites to the "Permitted Space Station List" to enable all authorized ALSAT-designated U.S earth stations to communicate with these satellites, pursuant to the Commission's recent order creating such a list²:

- 1.- Solidaridad 1 at 109.2° W:L:
- 2.- Solidaridad 2 at 113.0° WL
- 3.- Satmex 5 (Morelos 2R) at 116.8° W.L.

All of the satellites listed above have already been coordinated with the U.S. and have been granted access to the U.S. market ³ via prior FCC earth station authorizations. ⁴
