On June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017, representatives of Kepler Communications Inc. ("Kepler") met with representatives of the International Bureau to discuss Kepler's pending applications to operate non-geostationary satellite orbit ("NGSO") fixed-satellite service ("FSS") systems in the Ku-band. Participating in the meeting on behalf of the International Bureau were José Albuquerque, Kathryn Medley, Stephen Duall, Karl Kensinger, Cindy Spiers, and Carlos Flores. Participating in the meeting on behalf of Kepler were Mina Mitry and Nickolas Spina.

The meeting participants discussed the supplemental information provided by Kepler on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The commission requested further clarification on the information provided with regards to Kepler's beam pattern on the ground and EIRP density restrictions implemented via software. Kepler representatives noted that it's spacecraft components had successfully completed environmental testing and remained on track for launch at the end of 2017. In addition, Canada's new regulation on space station licensure (CPC-2-6-01) was discussed.

Pursuant to Section 1.1206(b)(2) of the FCC's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2), this *ex parte* notification is being filed electronically for inclusion in the public record of the above-referenced proceedings.
