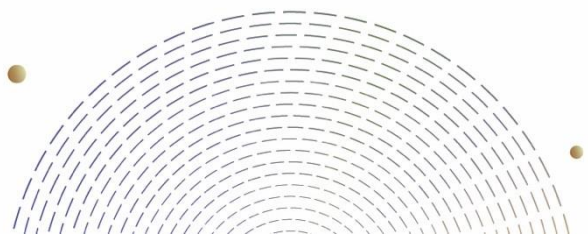
On January 26, 2021, Mangata Networks LLC (“Mangata”) met with International Bureau staff to discuss Mangata’s application for authorization to construct and launch a non-geostationary satellite orbit (“NGSO”) system, the Mangata Networks System (the “Application”). Mangata was represented by Brian Holz and technical consultant, Whitney Lohmeyer of Lohmeyer Consulting LLC. The International Bureau was represented by Karl Kensinger, Merissa Velez, Sankar Persaud, and Sean O’More.

During the meeting, Mangata encouraged staff to grant the Application, which will enable Mangata to deliver the lowest cost and highest performance capacity to anyone, anywhere by skillfully and cost-effectively combining terrestrial and satellite technologies to create a socially-responsible global network service provider.

Mangata reiterated that since its inception, the company has specifically focused on architecting an NGSO system that will utilize orbital and spectrum resources efficiently, and remains committed to coordinating in good faith to ensure harmonious coexistence with incumbent and future co-frequency entrants.
