

Exhibit A – Narrative

HawkEye 360, Inc. (“HE360”) seeks to extend for thirty days the special temporary authority (“STA”)¹ granted to HE360 on November 6, 2025. Grant of this STA extension is necessary and in the public interest because it will allow HE360 to continue demonstrations of its sensing capability for a United States government agency, in support of important and time-sensitive, national security interests.² HE360 is preparing a modification application reflecting the relevant changes and intends to submit the application soon.

¹ HE360 submitted the original STA application to the FCC by email on November 5, 2025, during the government shutdown, and the FCC granted that STA on November 6, 2025. After the government shutdown had ended, HE360 submitted an STA application in the ICFS database to capture the submission of the original STA application. *See* Application, ICFS File No. SAT-STA-20251119-00331 (filed Nov. 20, 2025).

² As explained in the original STA application, the HE360 satellites have antennas capable of sensing signals in the 20 to 88 MHz frequency band range, instead of the 30 to 88 MHz frequency band range. *See, e.g.*, Stamp Grant, ICFS File Nos. SAT-MOD-20240812-00180, SAT-MOD-20230724-00181, SAT-AMD- 20221014-00136, SAT-MOD-20220906-00099, at n. 14 (granted May 30, 2025, reissued June 18, 2025) (identifying the sensing capabilities of the HE360 constellation).
