Scope of Grant:	Special temporary authority for an additional period of 180-days to perform telemetry, tracking, and command operations (TT&C) to (1) undock the MEV-1 spacecraft from the Optus D3 space station at the 156°E.L. orbital location; (2) drift the MEV-1 spacecraft from the 156° E.L. orbital location to the 141° W.L. orbital location; and (3) if needed, maintain the MEV-1 at the 141° W.L. orbital location. ²

Unless otherwise specified herein, operations under this grant must comport with the legal and technical specifications and commitments set forth by the applicant or petitioner and with the Federal Communications Commission’s rules not waived herein. This grant is also subject to the following conditions: 1. All operations under this grant of special temporary authority must be on an unprotected and non-harmful interference basis, i.e., Space Logistics must not cause harmful interference to and must not claim protection from interference caused to it by any other lawfully operating station. In the event of any harmful interference under this grant of special temporary authority, Space Logistics must cease operations immediately upon notification of such interference and must inform the Commission, in writing, immediately of such an event. 2. Space Logistics must coordinate the operations of MEV-1 with existing geostationary space stations to ensure that no unacceptable interference results from its operations during its drift from the 156° E.L. orbital location to the 141° W.L. orbital location.		
Licensee/grantee is afforded thirty (30) days from the date of release of this action to decline the grant as conditioned. Failure to respond within this period will constitute formal acceptance of the grant as conditioned. This action is taken pursuant to Section 0.261 of the Commission’s rules on delegated authority, 47 CFR § 0.261, and is effective upon release.
