

Application for Special Temporary Authority

Capella Space Corp. hereby requests Special Temporary Authority (“STA”) for a period of 60 days to launch, deploy, and begin telemetry, tracking, and command (“TT&C”) communications for the Acadia-12 satellite in the Mid-Inclination orbital plane requested in ICFS File No. SAT-MOD-20260504-00184, modifying Call Sign S3178, while that application remains pending. That modification seeks, among other things, to add two additional satellites to the Acadia constellation, consolidate orbital planes, and extend the license term. This STA seeks a subset of that authority: to operate one satellite (Acadia-12) in the following orbital plane, as described in the pending application:¹

The radiofrequency characteristics of Acadia-12 are the same as those already authorized under Call Sign S3178. The TT&C frequencies are: uplink 2025–2110 MHz (center frequency 2036 MHz, 1.4 MHz bandwidth) and downlink 8025–8400 MHz (center frequency 8027 MHz, 1.4 MHz bandwidth). The initial orbit insertion range is 500–600 km $\pm$ 25 km, and the operational altitude range is 480–630 km.

This STA is necessary to allow Capella to meet an upcoming launch opportunity for Acadia-12 in early October 2026. Grant of this STA will serve the public interest by enabling Capella to continue deploying its next-generation synthetic aperture radar satellites, providing valuable earth-observation services for U.S. government, allied, and commercial customers who rely on timely, high-resolution SAR imagery for a wide range of national-security, business, and life-safety applications.
