
Through their counsel, NTT America, Inc., NTT Worldwide Telecommunications Corporation (“NTT WT”), Edge Cable Holdings USA, LLC (“Edge USA”), HKT Global (Singapore) Pte. Ltd., PLDT, Inc., SoftBank Corp., and Amazon Data Services, Inc. (collectively, “Licensees”) update the Commission regarding the above-referenced system.

First, the Licensees confirm that Edge USA and its affiliates decided to equip a second fiber pair on the system. Consequently, the voting and participation interests shown in Table 2 of the original cable landing license application reflect the current interests of the Licensees.¹

Second, NTT WT clarifies that it agrees to comply with the reporting requirements in 47 C.F.R. § 1.767(l).
