Re: *Retirement of TAT-14 Submarine Cable, File No. SCL-MOD-20040301-00011 (formerly SCL-LIC-19990303-00004)*

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Sprint Communications Company, L.P. (“Sprint”), on behalf of the TAT-14 submarine cable co-licensees, hereby provides notification to the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) that the TAT-14 submarine cable¹ will be retired from service on December 15, 2020.

The TAT-14 submarine cable is being retired because of the cost-effectiveness and availability of leased capacity compared to continuing to operate the submarine cable. All TAT-14 consortium members have been notified and overwhelmingly voted in favor of retiring the TAT-14 submarine cable on the date indicated above. Once retired, the TAT-14 submarine cable will no longer utilize the cable landing stations it has been utilizing, which are located in Manasquan, New Jersey and Tuckerton, New Jersey.

¹ The TAT-14 submarine cable was originally assigned File No. SCL-LIC-19990303-00004. The in-service date for the TAT-14 submarine cable is May 11, 2001. See, e.g., Letter from James Talbot, AVP-Senior Legal Counsel to AT&T, to Marlene H. Dortch, FCC Secretary, at 2 (Mar. 14, 2018). In 2004, AT&T Corp. filed a modification requesting to remove one party as a licensee. See Non-Streamlined International Applications Accepted for Filing, Public Notice, Report No. TEL-00780NS (Apr. 9, 2004). Once the modification was granted, the TAT-14 submarine cable was assigned File No. SCL-MOD-20040301-00011, which it has since retained.
