CABLE LANDING LICENSE MODIFICATION— REQUESTS TO ADD *PRO FORMA* CONDITION AND TO MODIFY "NO EXCLUSIVE ARRANGEMENTS" CONDITION

Pursuant to procedures established to implement the Commission's 2002 changes to its cable landing license rules, ¹ Telxius Cable USA, Inc., and Telxius Cable Puerto Rico, Inc. (together, "Licensees") hereby apply to modify the cable landing license for the South America-1 ("SAm-1") submarine cable system, a non-common carrier submarine cable system connecting Florida, Puerto Rico, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, and Peru. *First*, the Licensees request that the Commission modify the SAm-1 cable landing license to add a condition allowing for post-consummation notification of *pro forma* transactions. *Second*, the Licensees request that the Commission modify the SAm-1 cable landing license to modify the "no exclusive arrangements" condition and substitute it for a "no special concessions" condition.

The Commission granted a cable landing license for SAm-1 on August 10, 2000.² The Commission subsequently modified that cable landing license to authorize the extension of SAm-1 to Colombia.³ SAm-1 entered into commercial service on March 26, 2001.

I. ADDITION OF THE PRO FORMA CONDITION

The Licensees request that the Commission modify the SAm-1 cable landing license to add a condition allowing for post-consummation notification of *pro forma* transactions.⁴ 47 C.F.R. § 1.767(g)(7) sets forth the new *pro forma* condition. By the signature below, the Licensees certify that they accept and will abide by the *pro forma* condition.⁵

II. MODIFICATION OF THE "NO EXCLUSIVE ARRANGEMENTS" CONDITION

The Licensees request that the Commission modify the SAm-1 cable landing license to modify the "no exclusive arrangements" condition and substitute it for a "no special concessions" condition.⁶ 47 C.F.R. § 1.767(g)(5) sets forth the new "no special concessions" condition. By the signature below, the Licensees certify that they accept and will abide by this "no special concessions" condition.⁷
