**Re: *PC Landing Corp., SCL-LIC-20240424-00010, Report
under 47 C.F.R. § 1.767(l)***

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Dear Mr. Sullivan:

PC Landing Corp., the U.S. cable landing licensee for the Pacific Crossing cable system (“Pacific Crossing” or “PC-1”), hereby requests that the Commission afford confidential treatment to the reports submitted for the quarter ending March 31, 2026, under 47 C.F.R. § 1.767(l) in connection with the new 10-year cable landing license for PC-1, granted May 21, 2025. *See PC Landing Corp.*, File No. SCL-LIC-20240424-00010, Public Notice, DA 25-438 (May 22, 2025). These reports, submitted via the Commission’s International Communications Filing System (“ICFS”): (1) summarize the provisioning and maintenance of network facilities and services provided to Pacific Crossing by NTT Ltd Japan Corporation (Non-Public_PCLC_Attachment 1_Item 8_Provisioning and Maintenance_Confidential); and (2) provide the circuit status of PC-1 (Non-Public_PCLC_Attachment 2_Item 9_Active and Idle or Equivalent Circuits by Facility_Confidential), for the quarter ending March 31, 2026. Redacted, public versions of these reports are attached hereto.

In accordance with the *Cable Landing License Streamlining Order*,¹ PC Landing Corp. hereby requests that the Commission afford confidential treatment to the submitted reports. PC Landing Corp. also requests that it be provided with notice and opportunity to respond should the Commission receive any request for disclosure of the submitted information, whether in whole or in part. Pacific Crossing is a private cable system, and information on the facilities and services procured in connection with its operations and maintenance, as well as information on its

available capacity, idle circuits, and sold circuits, is all competitively sensitive, proprietary information of the type that would not ordinarily be made public. Under Section 552(b)(4) of the Freedom of Information Act and Sections 0.457(d) and 0.459 of the Commission's rules, the Commission need not disclose information that "would customarily be guarded from competitors," and would likely cause substantial competitive harm if disclosed. *See* 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4); 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.457(d) and 0.459.

The submitted reports satisfy these standards, containing highly confidential information regarding its network facilities in Japan, available capacity, and circuits sold, and as such is proprietary and competitively-valuable information. PC Landing Corp. has not made this information available to the public, nor has it been or will it be disclosed by PC Landing Corp. to third parties, other than in connection with its obligations to the Commission and other U.S. Government agencies as may be required. Accordingly, the Commission should treat the submitted reports as confidential and withhold them from public inspection.

PC Landing Corp. requests that the submitted reports be kept confidential indefinitely. The company does not foresee a time when it would be appropriate under Section 0.461 of the Commission's rules to disclose the information contained herein. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 0.461.
