Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 31, 2020, the Commission referred the above-referenced application to the relevant Executive Branch agencies in connection with a request by the applicants for a special temporary authority (STA). The Commission is notified that any request for the relevant Executive Branch agencies' views on potential national security or law enforcement concerns associated with this application is subject to review by the Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Services Sector (Committee) pursuant to Executive Order (E.O.) 13913.²

Section 2(b) of the E.O. defines "Application" as "any application, petition, or other request for a license or authorization, or the transfer of a license or authorization, that is referred by the FCC to the Committee " Therefore, when the Commission refers an STA for national security and law enforcement concerns, the Committee must utilize the E.O. process, including any relevant timelines to accommodate said process.³ As such, the Committee requests the Commission confirm that it requests to move forward with this referral under the E.O. process.⁴
