
Dear Assistant Secretary Daugherty:

On January 11, 2017, TeleGuam Holdings, LLC d/b/a GTA ("GTA") entered into an agreement with the Department of Homeland Security in connection with an application requesting Federal Communications Commission (FCC) authorization to construct, land, and operate a private, non-common carrier, fiber-optic submarine cable system with six segments connecting Indonesia, the Philippines, Guam, Hawaii, and California, which will be called the Southeast Asia-US ("SEA-US") Cable System (SCL-LIC-20150626-00016).

GTA and Forager Holdings Corp. ("Forager") have applied to the FCC for consent to transfer control of this cable landing license from GTA to Forager (SCL-T/C-20170210-00003). After this transaction is completed, Forager will control the portions of the SEA-US Cable System previously controlled by GTA, and will continue to undertake all obligations of GTA contained in the January 2017 agreement, including all relevant reporting requirements.

Forager understands and acknowledges the commitments set forth in the January 2017 Agreement, and further acknowledges that it will continue to comply with the terms, conditions, and requirements of such agreement after the transaction is completed.
