## WITHDRAWAL OF PETITION TO DENY OF IRIDIUM CONSTELLATION LLC

On May 26, 2017, Iridium Constellation LLC ("Iridium"), pursuant to Section

25.154 of the Commission's rules,<sup>1</sup> requested that the Commission deny the portion of

the above-referenced application (the "Application"), filed by Thales Avionics, Inc.

("Thales"), in which Thales requested a blanket license to operate earth stations aboard

aircraft in the 29.25-29.3 GHz band.<sup>2</sup> Iridium uses that band for its feeder links.

On June 5, 2017, Thales filed a reply in which, in response to Iridium's objections, Thales agreed to remove the 50 MHz portion of its Application covering the frequencies between 29.25 GHz and 29.3 GHz.<sup>3</sup> Iridium hereby withdraws its Petition to Deny, conditioned on grant of Thales' request to remove the 29.25-29.3 GHz band from its Application.
