Good morning, Happy Election day. I received a copy of the e-mail message you sent to Ken, follwing is the test of your message. The 6 GHz band for this site was limited due to interference considerations. We had to restrict the band to 6168.00 - 6425.00 MHz. There were no restriction requirements on the 4 GHz band, therefore the 3700 - 4200 MHz bandwidth was submitted. It is possible that this facility could receive signals anywhere in the 4 GHz band, just because we can only transmit in the limited 6 does not mean we should be limited in the 4. Depending on the specific service, it is possible that we could transmit information on one frequency and receive information on a transponder in the lower half of the 4 GHz band.
