NOTICE OF DISMISSAL

Dear Mr. Farrar:

On November 16, 2004, Farlink Satellite Services, Inc. filed a C-band¹ Transportable Earth Station Application. For the reasons discussed below, we dismiss your C-band Transportable Earth Station without prejudice to refile.

Under 47 C.F.R. § 1.1910, applications or other requests for benefits filed with the Commission are checked to determine whether the applicant is delinquent in any non-tax debt owed to the Commission.² On November 16, 2004, you were notified that Farlink Satellite Services, Inc. was delinquent on the payment of debts owed to the Federal Communications Commission.³ The letter informed you that if full payment or satisfactory arrangement to pay the delinquent debt was not made within 30 days of the date of the letter, your application or other request for benefit would be dismissed. The Commission has not received payment of the debts identified in the Red Light Letter, nor have satisfactory payment arrangements been made.
